



Assistant Concertmaster **Full-time Position**

Canadian National Auditions will be held by recorded submission on Tuesday, September 15, 2026.

Candidates advancing to the live rounds will be invited to audition in Edmonton for in-person auditions being held on **Monday, October 19, 2026, at 10:00am.**

Terms and conditions for the 2025-2026 Season for this position are:

Season:	A 41-week season, including 38 contiguous weeks from September to June plus 3 contiguous weeks from mid-August to early September
Remuneration:	Minimum \$70,873.05 for the full Season, 291 Services
Benefits:	A comprehensive and generous benefits package which includes 11% MPFC (Musicians Pension Fund of Canada) contribution and a 3% matching RRSP program

The successful candidate will start in September 2027.

Terms for the 2026-2027 Season and beyond have not yet been established.

Who we are:

As one of Canada's premier orchestras and music venues, the [Edmonton Symphony Orchestra \(ESO\) and Francis Winspear Centre for Music](#) provide musical experiences rooted in creativity, imagination, and excellence. Our purpose, as a united entity, is to fulfill the human need to make and share music.

Throughout our 74-year history, the ESO has become known as one of Canada's foremost orchestral ensembles. Our 56 musicians are led by renowned Music Director Jean-Marie Zeitouni. Located on Indigenous peoples' traditional lands, we are dedicated to providing a safe, welcoming, and accessible space for our community to create, exhibit, and learn about music.

As the cornerstone of the Francis Winspear Centre for Music, the ESO connects diverse communities through a shared musical language, honouring the great works of the past while boldly championing authentic contemporary voices. By passionately sharing orchestral music in its full spectrum of style, tradition and expression, we explore the depth and breadth of the human experience through performances which are thrilling, profound,

and life-changing. By doing so, we keep art alive and thriving as a force which uplifts our city, shakes off the dust of everyday life, and reminds us all of our collective humanity.

Since 1997, the ESO's home has been the Francis Winspear Centre for Music, in downtown Edmonton. Known internationally as one of the best acoustic venues in North America, the Winspear welcomes 250,000 visitors annually for musical performances, rehearsals, educational programs, and a wide range of other events. We are currently [expanding the building](#), adding a 500-seat performance hall, classrooms, and mixed-use immersive spaces, with an anticipated opening date in late 2027. The Winspear and ESO are managed by a combined board of directors and administrative team, allowing for creative maximization of schedule and activities that serve both entities.

The ESO and Winspear are renowned for our Learning Programs, which include:

- [a range of Conservatory programs](#) including private lessons, chamber music programs, and a Young Composers Project
- [programs for both youth and adults aimed at musical discovery](#), including adult "Scratch Classes", daycamps, and music classes for young children
- [a range of programs offered to schools and groups](#), including education concerts, musician-in-the-school programs, and field trips to the Winspear.

ESO musicians are invited to teach, lead, and engage with these programs, and are also encouraged to submit proposals for new programs or projects they would like to pursue.
