About you

The successful candidate is an emerging director with demonstrated maturity, resilience, self-motivation and of course, directing experience. They will have trained at a performing arts institution or have similar practical experience.

Applicants may have previous experience directing opera, music theatre or theatre at the university, community, independent and/or professional level and have demonstrated interest in both traditional and contemporary opera.

Applicants read music proficiently and have knowledge of a language (Italian, French, German or other) or have an aptitude to learn.

Applicants are selected based on prior training, experience, and/or interest in opera.

The criteria for Directors includes but is not limited to:

- Demonstrated ability to adapt: to elicit the dramatic intent of operatic repertoire and a willingness to explore.
- Musicianship and Interpretation: Strong musicality, understanding of performance practice.
- A genuine curiosity and passion for the opera art form that drives the pursuit of excellence.
