Senior Artist (f) as Female-Artist-in-Residence (FAiR) in classical percussion instruments

From the 2026 semester, we require a Senior Artist for the FAiR programme for the advancement of women at Mozarteum University (temporary, parttime).

Who can apply?

Outstanding young female conductors with a focus on classical percussion instruments (orchestra, solo and chamber music) holding a completed, relevant artistic Master's or diploma degree who, in addition to an international career, also aspire to a career as a university professor.

Application requirements:

- Concept paper (max. 2 sides of A4) for a project to carry out during the residence with the support of students at the Mozarteum University. We particularly welcome projects that contribute to making the repertoire more diverse and performance formats more innovative, those that critically examine artists' practices with regard to power and domination, and/or that promote democratic education.
- Good communication skills and ability to work as part of a team
- Very good written and oral German and English.

We can offer the successful applicant:

- Regular work with students in the percussion class (ZKF, IGP, Pre-College, Post-Graduate, ME) in the specialist classical percussion repertoire in the context of individual units, chamber music rehearsals and workshops.
 Completion of an independent project to be presented publicly at the Mozarteum University Salzburg
- Regular work with students in carrying out projects
- Participation in the continuing education opportunities/information and gualification offers provided
- Choosing Salzburg as your home for the duration of the residency.

We can offer the successful applicant:

- Acquisition of teaching experience and a broad range of information and qualification offers under university structural framework conditions, university didactics, strategies for career planning, competency training in self-management and self-marketing, etc.
- Support from one or more mentors
- Possibility of carrying out your own project and making use of university facilities and networks to do so.

The salary is based on the corresponding collective agreement for university employees in salary group B1. The employment level is 75% (relative to a full-time position). The monthly salary is a minimum of € 2,786.10 gross (14x p.a.), and this may increase based on the provisions of the collective agreement and previous relevant experience. On request, accommodation in the city of Salzburg can be provided as a benefit in kind for the duration of the contract.

Travel and accommodation costs incurred as a result of the admission procedure cannot be reimbursed.

Mozarteum University Salzburg is striving to increase the number of women in research and teaching and, therefore, strongly encourages qualified individuals to apply. Individuals with disabilities, who are qualified, are also encouraged to apply.

Selection process

The commission will preselect from the applications received in a prompt and correct manner. The successful applicant will attend a hearing on 06.10.2025 which will include an artistic presentation (the programme must include at least three of the following instrument groups: orchestra-percussion, marimba and vibraphone, set-up, solo literature, drum set, timpani, percussion, theatrical percussion, world music), a demonstration lesson and the presentation of the project proposal.
