The third St Andrews Vocal Pedagogy Course seeks to attract experienced career singing teachers and performer/pedagogues interested in learning new skills and ways of teaching in both Classical, Contemporary and Music Theatre techniques.

- 1. An abstract of 300 words (+/- 10%)
- 2. A brief biography 100 words max

The best presentation will be invited give an hour presentation for the British Voice Association 'Talk Voice' series for a fee of £100.

Lynn Helding

is the author of the book The Musician's Mind: Teaching, Learning and Performance in the Age of Brain Science, deemed "a unique and outstanding contribution to pedagogy" by Voice and Speech Review and "groundbreaking ... an invaluable contribution to the field of music pedagogy" by opera star Renée Fleming. Her pedagogy honours include the 2005 Van Lawrence Voice Fellowship, membership of the prestigious American Academy of Teachers of Singing, and recognition as a "legendary figure in the field of voice pedagogy" by the Contemporary Commercial Music Vocal Pedagogy Institute at Shenandoah University, receiving their 2020 Lifetime Achievement Award. A thought-leader in the movement toward science-informed voice pedagogy, Helding is a co-founder of the NATS Science-Informed Voice Pedagogy Institute. Her stage credits include leading roles in opera, oratorio and musical theatre, and recitals featuring commissioned works and contemporary American music performed on multiple tours throughout the United States, Australia, England, France, Germany, Italy, Spain, and Iceland where her performances were broadcast on Icelandic National Radio. She currently serves as Professor of Voice in Vocal Arts and Opera and coordinator of Vocology and Voice Pedagogy at the University of Southern California Thornton School of Music. www.lynnhelding.com



Chris Johnson

West End leads, backing vocalists, major label singer/ songwriters and vocal coaches all put their trust in Chris to take good care of their voices. Chris also thoroughly enjoys the work he does with singing teachers all over the world, through his training company TeachVoice.com, to help them up-skill and navigate the overwhelming amount of pedagogical options. Chris has trained in laryngeal manual therapies and studied extensively with scientists in vocal acoustics, physical and somatic therapy, and laryngology. Through his popular podcast and blog, The Naked Vocalist, he has also had the opportunity to connect and share with many progressive voice researchers and pedagogues. "In the end", he says "the vocal instrument is incredibly complex involving the body, mind and soul. This complexity leads to new discoveries made and infinite variations seen, for which we need to allow when training someone. Despite this world of infinite nuance, there is a real simplicity to be found in both coaching and in singing, starting with being authentically YOU!"



Dr Jenevora Williams

is an expert in the fields of vocal health and singing teaching. After a successful career in opera, Jenevora turned her attention to investigating healthy and efficient vocal function. The combination of academic study and practical experience has resulted in a unique perception for understanding the human voice. She was the first singing teacher to be awarded a PhD in voice science in the UK, and won the 2010 BVA Van Lawrence Prize for her outstanding contribution to voice research. Her book, Teaching Singing to Children and Young Adults, has been enormously popular with singing teachers throughout the world. The substantially updated third edition is available now from Full Voice Music. Jenevora is wellknown for her imaginative and rigorous international training courses for singing teachers and voice professionals. She is director of Vocal Health Education and Evolving Voice, training the first generation of Voice Rehabilitation Specialists worldwide. As a teacher of singing, she works with professional singers of all ages in both voice rehabilitation and career mentoring. More details about Jenevora and her work can be found here.

Leuchars Railway Station is a ten-minute journey from St Andrews by bus or taxi. Direct bus services to St Andrews operate from Dundee, Edinburgh and Glasgow.

Accommodation

St Andrews Vocal Pedagogy Course participants enjoy simple, comfortable accommodation on a dinner, bed and breakfast basis at Agnes Blackadder Hall, a modern residence commended by the Scottish Tourist Board. It is situated 15 minutes' walk from the town and a 25-minute walk from the Laidlaw Music Centre. Each room contains a double bed, en-suite bathroom with shower, washhand basin and toilet, television and tea and coffee making facilities.
