

He is first violist of Solisti Veneti, and teaches at Internationale Sommerakademie Mozarteum in Salzburg, Mahler Jugend Orchester, Academy of the Mozart Orchestra, Royal College of Music, and Bologna Conservatory. He is President of Italia European String Teachers Association.

Fred Sherry (cello): Faculty at The Juilliard School, The Mannes School of Music and The Manhattan School of Music. He has introduced audiences on five continents and all fifty United States to the music of our time for over five decades. Carter, Davidovsky, Wuorinen and Zorn, have written concertos for him.

**Dylana Jenson (violin):** Mentors include Nathan Milstein, Joseph Gingold, Manuel Compinsky, and Dorothy DeLay. Former Visiting Associate Professor of the Practice in Violin and Viola at University of Notre Dame. Silver medalist at Tchaikovsky Competition. Grammy Award nominee. Studied at Juilliard.

Piero Bonaguri (guitar): Studied with Enrico Tagliavini, Alirio Diaz, Oscar Ghiglia and Andrés Segovia. Chamber music with Maxence Larrieu, Danilo Rossi, Daniela Uccello. Professor at Bologna Conservatory. He is published by Ut Orpheus.

**Bruno Canino (piano):** Famed Italian pianist that has collaborated with Itzhak Perlman, Salvatore Accardo, and Pierre Amoyal. Born in Naples, studied piano and composition at the Milan Conservatory, where he then taught for 24 years, and for ten years taught a course in piano and chamber music at the Bern Conservatory.
