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The 2024 Radda Rise International String Competition is dedicated to fostering the musical growth of rising musicians through unique educational opportunities. Aside from just cash prizes, we're passionate about providing an experience through which musicians can further their musical careers.

Each applicant will receive a video Radda Review of their competition recordings before they're sent to the jurors and have the option to resubmit new recordings after learning from their feedback.

Additionally, each applicant will receive a custom biography in English or revisions of their current biography, a private mentorship session with the competition director, and individual video comments from ALL jurors.

After the competition, applicants will have additional educational opportunities such as cash prizes, personalized starter websites, potential ongoing mentorship with the jurors and director, and discounted Radda Reviews.

## Jury Members



Manhattan School of Music Precollege Faculty

A highly sought-after pedagogue, violinist Elizabeth Faidley has been hailed as an "amazing and inspiring teacher" by the New York Times. She is the recipient of the American String Teachers' Association 2011 "Studio Teacher of the Year" award for the state of New Jersey. She has also been honored with multiple teaching awards. In addition to being on the faculty of the Pre-College Division of the Manhattan School of Music, she has a large private studio in NYC, and her students have won national and international competitions, performed at prestigious venues like Carnegie Hall and the White House, and been accepted with scholarships to top conservatories worldwide. The NY Times described Ms. Faidley as "...fiercely yet compassionately committed to her students, to her colleagues, and to the art of music."

Pala Garcia, a critically acclaimed violinist celebrated for her contemporary music expertise and social advocacy, has been highlighted as a musician to watch by the Washington Post and has received accolades from Strad Magazine as co-founder of the trio Longleash. With notable recordings like Passage and contributions to Soft Aberration, her work is widely recognized, earning her fellowships such as the 2023-2024 Artist Fellowship with the National Arts Club. Pala's performances span across Asia, Europe, and North America, with engagements in prestigious ensembles like the International Contemporary Ensemble and the Bavarian Radio Symphony Orchestra. She is deeply involved in Carnegie Hall's social impact programs, facilitating music-related community outreach in various social institutions. Set to release a solo album featuring Peter Kramer's music, she also teaches at the Juilliard School's Preparatory Division and Hunter College.



Pacific Symphony Orchestra & Active Studio Musician in Hollywood

Laszlo Mezo, a renowned cellist born in Budapest, Hungary, has built an illustrious career spanning performances with top orchestras and as a beloved studio musician in Hollywood. He gained national recognition as one of the top musicians of his generation when he won First Prize in the "Kertész Ottó Memorial Competition" at the young age of 18. Since then, he has won numerous other competitions which have brought him international recognition including the Fourth Prize in the "Antonio Janigro Junior International Competition" in 1998, Second Prize in the "International Dávid Popper Competition for Young Cellists" in 2000, the Special Prize in the "International Dávid Popper Cello Competition" in 2004, and First Prize in the "Ima Hogg International Competition" in 2008. Laszlo has made significant contributions to film music. He has played cello for numerous blockbuster film scores such as Star Wars, Super Mario, Ice Age, Life of Pi, Pirates of the Caribbean, Wolverine, and The Lone Ranger.

## Eligibility

The Radda Rise International String

Competition is open to string players of all
nationalities. Applicants must be within one
of the following age ranges at the time of
submitting the competition application:



- Category 1: Up to 9 years old
- o Category 2: Between 10-13 years old
- o Category 3: Between 14-17 years old
- Category 4: Between 18-34 years old



## Repertoire

- Every applicant is required to submit two (2)
  pieces within the following recommended
  timeframes. Applicants may submit pieces that
  are longer than these timeframes, but the jurors
  may not listen to the entire submission beyond
  these timeframes:
  - Category 1: up to 7 minutes
  - Category 2: up to 12 minutes
  - Category 3: up to 15 minutes
  - Category 4: up to 20 minutes
- The two pieces must be solo works that contrast in some way (i.e. a slow work and a fast work or works from contrasting eras of music).
- Accompanied or unaccompanied works are acceptable.
- Both pieces must be performed from memory.
- Movements of pieces are acceptable.
- Original compositions and improvisations will not be accepted.
- Recorded within the past year.





# Opportunities for All Applicants



#### Radda Reviews

All applicants a video Radda review (similar to a masterclass) of their competition recording and have the opportunity to resubmit a new recording for the judging round.



#### Biographies

Applicants may decide whether they'd like to receive (1) a full custom biography in English OR (2) revisions of their current biography in English. Both biography options are free to all applicants.



#### Juror Mentorship

After the competition, all applicants have the opportunity to be offered mentorship from the jurors. Mentorships will be offered at the discretion of the jurors. The extent and details of these mentorships will be determined between the applicant and the juror.



#### Director Mentorship

Applicants may sign up for private mentorship sessions with the competition director and founder of Radda, Michelle Schodowski, for advice on college applications, essays, career development, and more. All applications include one session, and certain prize winners will receive an unlimited number of sessions.

## Custom Website

#### Details

Competition applicants may upgrade their application to include a custom multipage website highlighting their music and personal brand. After discussing design preferences and content with applicants, Radda will design and create their entire website, applicants may request an unlimited amount of edits during the competition and up to two months after the conclusion of the competition.

Additionally, applicants will be provided with free training sessions to learn how to update and maintain their website in future, establish a custom domain, further develop their personal brands, build a mailing list, and create engaging content to drive organic traffic to their websites.



#### Winners

Certain prize winners will receive a custom website as part of their prize.

Any winners who receive the custom website as part of their prize will be fully refunded if they purchase a custom website prior to the winners' announcement.



#### Pricing

This may be purchased at the time of application submission or after submission at a special rate of \$245.

This rate is only available to competition participants. Please note that this is separate from the competition application fee.
